Open Day

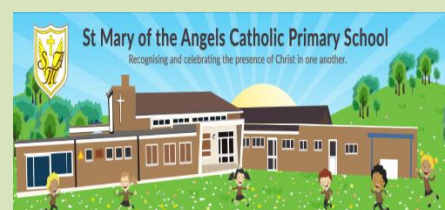
We are holding an open day for any prospective Nursery and Reception parents.
