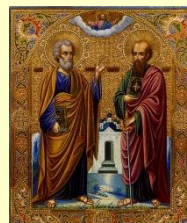

Yesterday was the Feast of St Peter and St Paul

St Peter and St Paul both had a great love for Jesus and spent their lives sharing his good news with as many people as they could. St Paul wrote in his letter to the Christians in Rome: 'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.'
St Paul said: 'May the Lord make our love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else.'
