Advent week 2 — Our Gateway Christmas donation fund, for needy local children, is open — with a massive £200+ to date. Thank you- please keep it coming. There are so many needy families out there. Our Christmas tree looks lovely, decorated with baubles representing your kindness and shining beautifully, with your compassion and love for others in our world. Our School Council braved the rain today, and have decorated a tree, for the Aldridge Tree Festival. Please see the attached Flyer with details of how you can visit it. Mrs Smith and Mrs Joyce were fiercely proud of our children and their commitment to helping others — thanks to them and to some helpful parents, also.

Christmas Nativities and the Covid picture. Our Covid numbers remain low now, in school, with 3 confirmed cases in the last 10 days. This matches the local updates, with Aldridge confirmed cases being lower than averages across England (up to 4<sup>th</sup> December 2021) At the moment, the KS1 nativity will be shared with one class of parents at a time, as detailed in letters received. This will be at 2.30pm on the given days- with parents (no more than 2) needing to arrive with masks. These will need to be worn during the performance and we will need clear evidence if people are exempt from mask wearing. We will also be asking you to confirm a negative LFT on arrival All seats will be socially distanced and the performance will be shortened. Please be aware, however, that it is subject to change dependent on numbers of Covid cases locally, and local advice. Thank you in anticipation for your full support. All other Christmas celebrations, including Early Years Advent activities and KS2 poems, songs etc, will be shared virtually, before the close of the term.
