

And finally:-. Over the past two weekends the gospel has focused our attention on our relationship with the Lord; on the need to listen to His voice and to be grafted onto Him as a branch to the vine. This weekend the gospel brings us to an understanding of what the consequence of this relationship is. Knowing fully, as we do, the "business of the master" we are called to put this faith into action. Today Christ tells us that the fruit we have to bear is love. A genuine love for our neighbour that manifests the very love that Christ has for us. As St. Paul reminds us, in his 1st Letter to the Corinthians, loving as the Lord loves is not going to be easy; he tells us that love is "always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish…". This self-sacrificial, selfless love, which draws the Cross of Christ through time into the present day, is the love that we must have for each other, the fruit that will last to eternity.
