Funding specialist PE teacher to work with primary teachers when teaching PE	£7000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Specialist teacher and Supercoach continue to be an asset to the school, impacting on standards, expectations and challenge for all groups , as identified through close monitoring of the P.E curriculum and provision across KS1 and KS2. They continue to be effectively deployed under the jurisdiction of Mrs Steele and Mrs O'Hara • Teachers have been able to access smaller groups during PE lessons with opportunities to assess next steps in learning. • Children consistently across almost all classes have good understanding of idea of what they are doing and why they are doing it, in P.E.
Funding release time for P.E teacher's professional development in PE and sport	£1000	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Engagement and motivation levels are noticeably increased and disadvantaged pupils are more inclusive to a level they can access, in line with their levels of understanding. • Long term monitoring has revealed that individual children with vulnerabilities are now able to be much more inclusive since 2014, as a result of increased knowledge and more tailored provision. • Investment in Swimming lessons with specialist teacher as a coach has impacted on children's progress in swimming in line with statutory requirements and their access to the wider curriculum. It has laso supported their personal wellbeing and safety knowledge and progress.

In 2015 2016 we hope to engage in a few more games/interschool competitions • Dance- School participated in two dance festivals regionally at KS1 and 2; they also danced at school events and assemblies. • Tennis- We took part in after school training and participated in local competitions achieving 2nd and 4th places with a team A and B. • Rounders- Our team came 2nd overall in the Catholic interschools' competition • Netball – Our team came 2nd overall in the Walsall Schools' Netball • Tag Rugby - At Catholic and local interschool competitions, we achieved 2nd and 3rd place • Gymnastics- our team got through to the finals of the Regional gymnastics tournament

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multi skills – our children at KS1 and at KS2 achieved 2nd place in both competitions • Swimming- Y4 received 13 sessions of intensive swimming lessons with good evidence of improvement particularly with non swimmers and beginners. • Parent/Children fitness- A child/parent fitness club was trialled with some interest growing in 2014 2015 • School still places great emphasis on matching sporting behaviour and good team spirit to sporting prowess and success. We work hard to instil these additional expectations into children. • School still continues to be proud of the impact sports and participation has on almost all pupils with regard to building self belief, self esteem and meeting and exceeding personal challenges- this links in with our mission statement and fostering of Christian and British values
Investing time into maximising resources available in school	£1000 budgeted approx £400 spent	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Sports coach has been a real asset to school; supporting smaller games, coaching and mentoring children's involvement and capacity to play games. He also actively and effectively supports the school ethos with regard to fair play and team spirit. • Lunchtime Supervision has been innovated with good success to allow children to invent, play and lead small games more frequently using varied equipment and environments • Bought in additional resources have supplemented the above • The investment in play equipment and new P.E mats has boosted children's access to outside play. Indoor P.E and how to be safe but fit. • Children use equipment daily- they look forward to it in almost all cases; children have access to Sports coach support daily- they enjoy and grow as a result of opportunities to play, to succeed, to challenge, to win and to lose graciously- a skill which many find hard to recognise as vital for life.
