Dear Parents,

<u>Behaviour consistency - non negotiable</u> - Thank you to all parents for their backing, both verbally and through actions, this week, with regard to baseline expectations for behaviour on the school site. There are still a couple of children who think that they can "mess about with mum or dad". They have been really sad when asked to spend the first part of break with me. After a free six months, we need to really re-establish safety and clear parameters. I look forward to your full co-operation.

<u>Masks now required on school site for parents</u> – Following on from the Ministerial broadcast earlier in the week, staff and Governors have made the decision to require parents, on school site, to wear masks when collecting and dropping their children off. I will not be policing this, folks - my role is to support staff and children. However, I trust that you will recognise the need to be safe amongst each other. You wearing a mask protects others; others wearing a mask protects you. We need to be team players, just like we were in March, May and June. Staff have been directed to avoid face to face conversations at the gate - please don't delay them. The office staff will willingly book a phone call or an appointment for you to discuss things safely.

Office staff reserve the right to politely refuse to forward items that children and parents have forgotten to bring in to school This is part of resilience, Mums and Dads. It is interesting that it is not our children with special needs (or their parents) who forget. Please respect the already high workload of our secretarial staff - like you, they are very busy people. Thank you in anticipation.
