Dear Parents,

We have had such an energetic and fun-filled week, joining in and learning about mental health, with this year's theme of 'Let's Connect' and Safer Internet Day, all about 'Want to talk about it?' making space for conversations about life online. Both of these themes highlight the importance of communication, conversation and interaction in keeping children mentally healthy and safe. A while ago, ITV launched an initiative - Get Britain Talking - with tips to support children:

- Children are more likely to open up if conversation isn't the main focus. Shared activities, like going for a walk or cooking together create a more relaxed environment. Putting them at ease means they'll feel more comfortable talking.
- Reassure them that you're there for them and they can talk whenever they need to.
- Suggest a way for them to communicate if they don't feel like talking - could they write a note, draw a picture or send a message?

The children enjoyed their online safety workshops this week. Place2Be has a lot of resources which may be of use, and their area called Parent Smart has five-minute read articles on a wide range of parenting and wellbeing topics on areas such as boundaries, meal times, supporting talents and social media. 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Notices and Curriculum Information

- Reading Update: Ask questions when you are reading with your child - what can you see in the page? How do you think the characters feel? You could also see if your child has any questions about what they have read.

Ask Questions

Ask questions about the story as you read it e.g. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Be Seen

Make sure you are seen reading. Keep books magazines at easy reach.

Get Out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.
