

And finally:-. In the words of a very famous song by Dinah Washington "What a difference a day makes, 24 little hours". On Monday 12<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 5:15pm, I walked from my room in Rowley Hall Hospital down to the operating theatre at the end of the corridor. Within seconds the Anaesthetist had inserted a cannula into my hand and time stood still until I woke in the recovery room, with a nurse by my side, at 8pm. In what seemed to me to be nothing more than the twinkling of an eye I was back in my room, lying in bed flat on my back, completely pain free - the first time in more than 6 months. By Tuesday morning the Physiotherapists had me in and out of bed, sitting down, standing up, walking up and down the corridor and the stairs; and, having completed all they'd asked of me, they informed the Sister in charge that day that I could be discharged from the hospital. Whilst I am still very sore from the procedure, and having to take things easy, which as you will know for me is not at all "easy", the transformation in how I am today, compared to how you saw me last weekend, is indescribable. At this point, as I hope to be able to tell you more about my progress in the weeks to come, I would simply like to thank each and every one of you for your continued prayers, support and encouragement, well wishes and cards.
