This week, the children have taken part in induction week within their classes. This includes a re-cap on some key areas of learning covered in autumn term. It includes work on the British values - looking at individual liberty and mutual respect, our behaviour and safeguarding policies and procedures (including who are trusted adults the children can go to if they have any worries). The children have also been learning about how to keep safe online and about their emotional resilience and wellbeing - dealing with emotions and calming and regulating techniques.

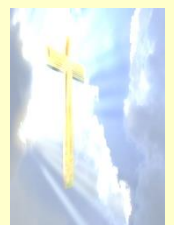
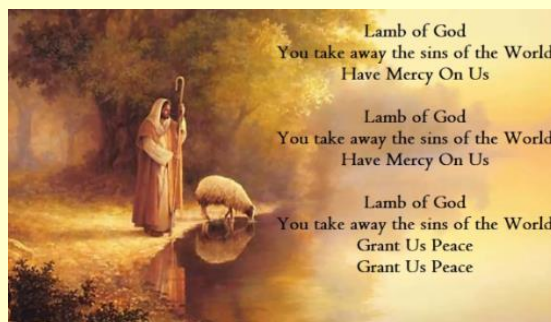
Reflection and Prayer
